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# **Future Education Model**

- "Effective January 1, 2024, the Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR) will require a minimum of a master's degree to be eligible to take the credentialing exam to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN)."
- *"In order to be approved for registration examination eligibility with a bachelor's degree, an individual must meet all eligibility requirements and be submitted into CDR's Registration Eligibility Processing System (REPS) before 12:00 midnight Central Time, December 31, 2023."*
- *"For more information about this requirement visit CDR's website:* <u>https://www.cdrnet.org/graduatedegree</u>."
- *"In addition, CDR requires that individuals complete coursework and supervised practice in program(s) accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND)."*
- *"Graduates who successfully complete the ACEND Nutrition and Dietetic Internship program at Puerto Rico Department of Health are eligible to apply to take the CDR credentialing exam to become an RDN."*

# How the Program Fits into the Credentialing Process:

- Registration:
  - Successful completion of the program provides eligibility to take the RD/RDN Exam administrated by the CDR.
  - Upon approval of the exam the student becomes a RD/RDN.

# How the Program Fits into the Credentialing Process:

- Puerto Rico Licensure:
  - Completion of the program provides eligibility to take the state board exam.

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- State licensure is conceded upon approval of the RDN exam.

• To prepare entry level Registered Dietitian Nutritionists, for present and future roles; based in public health, through supervised practices consistent with the standards of education from the ACEND.

## Description of the Program: Goal #1

Program graduates will be prepared to be competent entry level Registered Dietitians-Nutritionists.

#### *Objectives / Target Measures:*

- 1. "At least 80% of interns complete program requirements within 15 months (150% of planned program length)".
- 2. "At least 50% of program graduates take the CDR credentialing exam for dietitian nutritionist within 12 months of program completion".
- 3. "The program's one-year pass rate (graduates who pass the registration exam within one year of first attempt) on the CDR credentialing exam for dietitian nutritionists is at least 80%".

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- 4. "Of graduates who seek employment, at least 70% are employed in nutrition and dietetic or related fields within 12 months of graduation".
- 5. 90% of the employers will rate graduates' performance as satisfactory or above.
- 6. The program pass rate on the local exam for licensed nutritionist dietitian is at least 80%.
